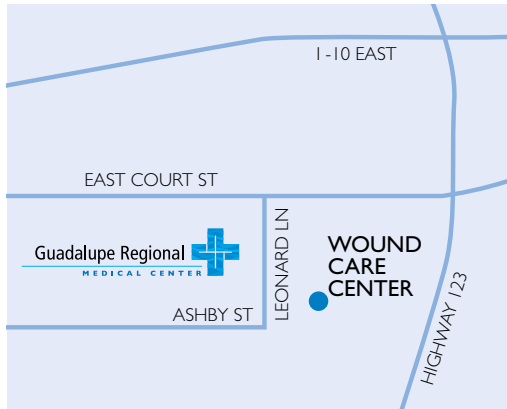

Dr. Duane Dietz and Dr. Terri Quebedeaux, both highly trained in wound care treatment, treat patients of the Guadalupe Regional Wound Care Center. Dr. Dietz, who practiced locally as an ER physician for seven years, trained in hyperbaric and wound care medicine at the Nix Hospital in San Antonio for eight years. He is now Board Certified in Undersea and Hyperbaric Medicine. Dr. Quebedeaux, trained in podiatry and wound care, specializes in treating lower extremity wounds.

The Wound Care Center staff utilizes the latest treatment technology and regularly incorporates advancements in products and cures. One of these advanced techniques is the use of TCPO2 technology. This equipment measures the oxygenation of the wound area and limbs with a noninvasive procedure, providing information about the potential for healing and how to proceed with treatment. Another therapy used by the Wound Care Center staff is VAC Therapy, the controlled application of negative pressure to a wound to help promote healing.

The Wound Care Center treats patients of all ages, from the very young to the elderly. The physicians at the Wound Care Center have helped patients identify undiagnosed diseases that may have affected their healing process, such as diabetes and high blood pressure. With the help of their primary physicians, these patients can learn to make positive changes in their lives that could improve their health in the future.

The Center provides evaluation, treatment, and management of numerous types of problem wounds, including:

- Diabetic ulcers
- Pressure sores
- Venous stasis ulcers
- Non-healing surgical wounds
- Gangrene
- Wounds complicated by soft tissue infections

Wound Care Center patients are exceptionally satisfied with the results of their treatments and the staff's services. Patients who completed their patient satisfaction surveys gave the Center the highest possible ratings.

Patients are typically referred to the Wound Care Center by their primary care physicians. More than 65 physicians currently refer patients to the Wound Care Center. The physicians at the Wound Care Center then work collaboratively with the patient's doctor until the wound is healed. Detailed reports are provided to the physician about their patient's treatment and progress. Upon completion of treatment, patients return to their primary care physicians.
