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DIABETES

Get education and support at GRMC

Whether it's type 1, type 2 or gestational, diabetes is a group of diseases characterized by high levels of glucose (sugar) in the blood. It may be that the pancreas doesn't make enough insulin or that the body isn't using insulin effectively. Whatever the case, the result is too much sugar in the blood, which can harm organs and lead to serious problems.

Type 1 and type 2 diabetes

Type 1 diabetes usually begins in childhood or young adulthood. It occurs when the pancreas doesn't make enough insulin—or makes no insulin at all. That's why people with type 1 need to regularly take insulin, often with daily injections.

Type 2 diabetes is the most common type. About 90 to 95 percent of adults diagnosed with diabetes have type 2. Type 2 occurs when the pancreas doesn't make enough insulin or doesn't use it properly. Genetics, diet and inactivity are all probable causes. Medicines and sometimes insulin are needed to treat it.

Endocrinologist Daniel Okorodudu, MD, has teamed up with GRMC's Diabetes Nurse Educator Ann Camacho, RN, BSN, to offer education and support groups. The accredited, fiveweek diabetes education program touches on topics such as monitoring blood sugars, healthy eating, getting active and medications.

Gestational diabetes

Some women who've never had diabetes develop it during pregnancy. Gestational diabetes usually resolves once the baby is born. However, it increases the mother's risk for future type 2 diabetes—as well as the baby's risk. In addition to our diabetes education, GRMC offers gestational diabetes education for mothers coping with diabetes during their pregnancy.
