#### New protocols

#### Daily, 24/7 care

Open 365 days a year (including all holidays), from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., the Guadalupe Regional Urgent Care Center is staffed with board-certified providers who are trained and experienced in caring for people of every age—from newborns to seniors.

The center has on-site x-ray capability and is technologically connected to the team of board-certified radiologists at GRMC for timely imaging analysis. Laboratory equipment is also available for on-site diagnosis of flu, strep throat and urinary tract infections. Specialty support is available through well-established relationships with local orthopedists; cardiologists; ear, nose and throat specialists; gynecologists; and more.

Local businesses will also benefit from the new center at Clear Springs. Workrelated injuries can be quickly and expertly treated at the center, with continuity and follow-up care provided by physicians within the GRMC health system.

## Urgent vs. Emergency

Where do you go when you need medical care quickly—say for a bump, a bruise or a bellyache? Urgent care centers can manage many minor illnesses and injuries. But some symptoms call for emergency care.

## Go to a **primary care** provider for:

- ✓ Annual wellness visits
- ✓ Chronic disease management
- Immunizations

If your doctor has walk-in appointments or same-day appointments, your primary care physician can see you for many minor illnesses and injuries if their schedule allows.

## Go to **urgent care** for mild or minor:

- ✓ Allergic reactions or rashes
- ✓ Cuts, burns or wounds
- ✓ Headaches
- Illnesses, such as colds, sore throats, earaches and low-grade fevers
- Injuries, such as back pain, sprains and strains
- ✓ Nausea or vomiting
- Lacerations and stitches

#### Play it safe.

## Call 911 or go to the **ER** for:

- Allergic reactions with trouble breathing, hives or swelling
- Chest pain that lasts for more than a few minutes
- Difficulty breathing
- Heavy bleeding, severe burns or deep wounds
- High fever with a headache or stiff neck
- Injury to the neck, spine or head, especially with other symptoms
- Passing out, fainting or seizures
- Poisoning or overdose
- Serious injuries, such as broken bones
- Severe and persistent vomiting or diarrhea
- Sudden severe headache or pain, such as in the jaw or arm
- Sudden confusion, weakness, loss of balance, face drooping, blurred vision or slurred speech

Unfortunately, there are many families around the nation and in our region who struggle with food insecurity. With the COVID-19 outbreak and ensuing job losses and uncertainties, the shortage of groceries became a forefront issue for families who had never imagined being in a food line.

Other sources of community assistance have come from local businesses, the school district and hundreds of volunteers who stepped up to provide over \$20,000 worth of in-kind contributions for the hospital's

frontline staff. Hundreds of hand-sewn cloth masks and supplies of hand sanitizer were generously provided to GRMF and our Guadalupe Healthcare Network for staff and local physicians.

We understand that almost everyone needs a hand at some point in their lives. We are glad to be in a position to coordinate and provide that help for those in current need.

#### A world-class diagnostic center for women

In the meantime, GRMF continues to help plan for the hospital's future. Our current focus and greatest need is the Women's Imaging Center. We have already raised \$375.000 of the \$500.000



needed for the construction of this world-class diagnostic center for women, expected to be completed by November.

The private, convenient and beautifully appointed center will offer 3D breast imaging and ultrasound, image-guided stereotactic biopsies, pelvic ultrasounds, and bone density studies.

Every dollar donated will have a great impact in bringing advanced preventative, diagnostic and therapeutic care to the women of our community.
